Dear Chairmen and Ranking Members:

As the House Subcommittee on Agriculture, Rural Development, Food and Drug Administration and Related Agencies begins consideration of its Fiscal Year (FY) 2015 appropriations bill, we urge you to include robust funding for the Emergency Watershed Protection (EWP) program. The EWP program, administered by the USDA's Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), helps public and private landowners address imminent hazards to life and property caused by floods, fires, and severe storms. EWP funding is essential to protecting citizens' lives and critical infrastructure in the wake of a natural disaster.


In total, nineteen states, including Alaska, Arkansas, California, Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Indiana, Iowa, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Oklahoma, Oregon, Tennessee, Texas, and Utah, are awaiting EWP funds. Critical EWP funding will help communities affected by the 2013 Colorado flood complete critical restoration projects that will stabilize river banks, remove debris in streams, and relocate rivers. These funds will also help Utah citizens recover from last year's floods and fires that swept the state. It will provide relief to residents of Galena, Alaska who are awaiting \$8,100,000 to recover from ice jams that caused river waters to surge more than 15 feet last May. And it will help Florida communities who desperately need to address damage caused by Tropical Storms Debby and Isaac before this year's storm season begins.

Funding for EWP must be authorized by Congress. Unfortunately no recent spending measure has provided such funding for the numerous natural disasters that occurred across the country in 2013. NRCS needs at least \$120,305,334 to fund recovery projects on its EWP waitlist. Importantly, this estimate does not include recent natural disasters such as the mudslides in

Washington, or critical funding to mitigate and plan for the risk of future disasters. Consequently, we respectfully request that this Subcommittee provide robust funding in its annual appropriations measure to provide for communities dealing with the aftermath of natural disasters.
